What is JDC West?

JDC West is Canada's largest business competition and is a three-day event that showcases academics, athletics, debate, and an out-of-the-box social competition. The part we're asking for your help on is the academic case competition.

The format of the case competition has a team of three students assume the role of consultants for a three-hour period. In this time they analyze a business case study¹, prepare a series of recommendations, and present to a panel of judges for 20 minutes.

Your Role

There are three ways to get involved, with opportunities for overlap as well. The schedules for each are <u>here</u>.

- 1. **[3-5 hours/week] Academic Coach.** Each academic team will have 3-5 coaches work with them every week from September 6 to January 14. Coaches read the case, watch the presentation, and provide feedback. Additionally, coaches are welcome to come to our workshops and run breakout sessions for their small team.
- 2. **[2-4 hours/event] Mock Case Competition (MCC) Judge.** We have five MCCs this year. These are designed to replicate the academic component of the JDC West weekend, and judges would be expected to judge at least two MCCs. Coaches are encouraged to be MCC judges as well!
- 3. **[2-4 hours/event] Simulation Judge.** We have two Simulations this year. These are designed to replicate the *entire* JDC West weekend, and judges would be expected to judge at least <u>one</u> simulation. We highly suggest this role for those wishing to get involved but with a <u>minimal time</u> commitment.

With each role you get a chance to work with the brightest and hardest working students in Western Canada. The average and median GPA of this year's competitors is **3.90**, and each student is committed to

putting in 20 hours/week^2 to JDC West this year. In the summer, those in Vancouver spent every Saturday in a Strategy and Advanced Corporate Finance class with us from 9:00 am - 6:30 pm discussing cases they spent about 15 hours during the week to prepare. Those abroad also prepared their cases and submitted them for review on a weekly basis.

We think this is a wonderful opportunity for students, coaches, and judges alike to learn and grow together. We are here to support the development of all and will provide the resources and environment for that.

Time Commitments

Competitors

For reference, <u>here</u> is the schedule all academic competition members received (excluding case practices). Competitors have also completed our summer development program³, which required them to analyze 2-4 cases each week along with 3-4 supplementary readings. Coaches and judges are welcome to come to any of the Weekends, especially if they want to use some of that time to run a breakout session with their team. In the past coaches and teams have struggled to coordinate times, so we've set aside times on Saturdays and some Sundays for that.

Academic Coach Schedule

Note that all coaches are welcome to be MCC judges as well and attend the simulations. Additionally, as mentioned above, coaches are welcome to attend any of the workshops or MCC days before the MCC begins to run team specific workshops.

We repeatedly reopened applications for *four months* to find the perfect team. These students put in 30 hours/week into JDC West this summer alongside their full time jobs, so feel free to work them as hard as you want—they'll thrive with it, we promise!

³ Summer Development Program. Students this year were required to spend the summer (May to July) taking a course with us primarily on Strategic Management and Finance. Every week they were required to read approximately 5 HBR articles (~15 pages each) and prepare 3 case studies (~20 pages each). On Sunday we would meet to discuss the cases from 9:00am – 6:30pm.

The course's curriculum, modelled heavily after the first year strategy and finance courses of Harvard, Ivey, and Darden, was meant to address the most common feedback our JDC West teams have been receiving: a disconnect between their recommendations and the organization's overarching strategy. - Case Studies. Coaches will be provided with relevant cases along with expected learning outcomes from each case.
- Coaching workshop. Our head coaches, Chad Dylan and Dylan Callow, will be providing all coaches with material outlining best practices in how to coach.
- Discipline Specific Learning Plans. New in 2017, coaches will be provided with a detailed learning plan for their discipline. These are broken down into modules with readings covering every topic in the discipline from an academic perspective.
- Prior year case analysis. Also new in 2017! Our head coaches and captains went through every JDC West case from 2010 onwards to determine (a) what each discipline truly entails in the context
